What information we collect, use, and why

We collect or use the following information to provide our services, including delivery and third party referrals:

- Names and contact details
- Gender
- Addresses
- Date of birth
- Service use history
- Website user information (including user journeys and cookie tracking)

We collect or use the following information to receive donations or funding and organise fundraising activities:

• Names and contact details

We collect or use the following personal information for the purpose of detection, investigation, and/or by extension when working for the Police, prosecution of crimes:

• Names and contact information

- Customer or client accounts and records
- Video recordings of public areas (including indoor and outdoor spaces)
- Audio recordings of public areas (including indoor and outdoor spaces)
- Information relating to health and safety

We collect or use the following personal information to comply with legal requirements:

- Name
- Contact information
- Health and safety information

We collect or use the following personal information for dealing with queries, complaints or claims:

- Names and contact details
- Address

We also collect or use the following information for dealing with queries, complaints or claims:

Lawful bases and data protection rights

Under UK data protection law, we must have a "lawful basis" for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO's website.

Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are in brief set out below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO's website:

- Your right of access You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for. You can read more about this right here.
- Your right to rectification You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete. <u>You can read more about this right here</u>.
- Your right to erasure You have the right to ask us to delete your personal information. You can read more about this right here.

- Your right to restriction of processing You have the right to ask us to limit how we can use your personal information. You can read more about this right here.
- Your right to object to processing You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data. You can read more about this right here.
- Your right to data portability You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you. <u>You can read more about this right here</u>.
- Your right to withdraw consent When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. You can read more about this right here

If you make a request, we must respond to you without undue delay and in any event within one month.

Our lawful bases for the collection and use of your data

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information to provide services and goods, including delivery and third party referrals are:

• Contract – we have to collect or use the information so we can enter into or carry out a contract with you. All of your data protection rights may apply except the right to object.

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information to receive donations or funding and organise fundraising activities are:

• Consent - we have permission from you after we gave you all the relevant information. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to object. To be clear, you do have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information for the prevention, detection, investigation or prosecution of crimes are:

- Contract we have to collect or use the information so we can enter into or carry out a contract with you. All of your data protection rights may apply except the right to object.
- Legal obligation we have to collect or use your information so we can comply with the law. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to erasure, the right to object and the right to data portability.

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information to comply with legal requirements are:

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information for dealing with queries, complaints or claims are:

Where we get personal information from

- Directly from you
- Family members or carers
- Charities or voluntary sector organisations
- Councils and other public sector organisations

How long we keep information

Information is retained for 10 years after which it is assessed for destruction. It will be presumed destruction will take place unless the material forms part of an investigation and then it will be retained indefinitely

Who we share information with

Others we share personal information with

- Organisations we need to share information with for safeguarding reasons
- Emergency services
- Organisations we're legally obliged to share personal information with

How to complain
